Greetings from your Pastor

"I think it was Saint John Chrysostom - said, 'when you take communion, you receive fire.' You ought to leave breathing joy, with the strength to transform the world." - Oscar Romero May 28, 1978

What would it mean to transform the world? Maybe it would mean global changes like resolving conflicts and creating peace, or ending hunger and poverty. Could it even be that transforming the world includes changing the way we interact with one another, or leaving a positive impact in culture, systems, and structures. And still, this all seems like an impossible monumental task to transform the whole world.

Bishop Romero spent the end of his ministry proclaiming a liberating God that showed up in the valleys of life. He held special hope for people experiencing injustice, oppression, and persecution. I dare say that his hope for a transformed world was because of living life on the margins and truly understanding the plight of God's people. Still, Romero did more than hope for transformation, he believed that holy communion would give people the strength to go out and do it!

I wonder if we hold back from using all the transformative powers within us because we lack hope and courage. If we think that there is no hope to change the world, it makes sense that we wouldn't try.

And

yet, aren't all things possible where God leads us? Won't God make a space of resounding hope and promise in the darkest of valleys? When we come to worship we are reminded of this very hope through God's word and the acclamations of song. Maybe it is that we often lack the courage to go out with that hope of transforming the world? With a world so enmeshed in violence and the presence of evil all around, it requires courage to transform. It takes our courage to risk failure, shame, hurt, doubt, and rejection. And yet are these not the exact things that Christ conquered in his own death and resurrection? Did Christ not experience hurt, shame and rejection, and show us God understands? So then we as disciples can go out with hope and courage to transform the world.

Each and every one of you has the power to transform the world. It may be a monumental idea, task, or calling you face. But also, maybe it all starts with one moment. When we gather on Sundays for communion, we are given the opportunity to leave whatever burdens we carry behind, and be filled instead with the fire of the Spirit. The world needs people who love abundantly, care deeply, advocate powerfully, and offer mercy endlessly. We are those people. Having been fed by the body and blood of Christ. Let us go out and transform the world.

Pre-Identification Form now available

The pre-identification form is now available for those individuals interested in offering the name of a rostered minister of Word and Sacrament (a pastor) in the ELCA for consideration for call to be elected Bishop of the New England Synod. Any pastor in good

standing on the ELCA roster in the United States is eligible to be named.

The form will be available from February 1-29, 2024, and will be closed permanently after that point. Individuals whose names are submitted will be contacted to determine if they'd like to discern a call to bishop, and if so, will provide biographical information that will be made available on the synod website in April.

At the start of Synod Assembly on June 6, 2024, the names of these pre-identified persons will be included on the first ballot for the bishop election, along with the opportunity for an alternative candidate's name to be written in. The remainder of the election process will follow the guidelines outlined in our synod constitution, which may be found on the synod website here.
